

2. Make social connections.


Loneliness and boredom are common among retirees, students, and transplants to a new city. Volunteering can relieve this sense of social isolation and help you fill empty hours in the day.

4. Develop and grow as a person. Volunteering is an excellent way to explore your likes and dislikes. If you're interested in a new career, volunteer in the field first to see if you will actually like it.

5. Gain a new perspective. Volunteering can offer a new perspective-seeing people who are worse off than you are, yet still hanging in there, can help you see your life in a whole new light.

6. Know that you're



needed. Feeling needed and appreciated are important. When you volunteer, you realize just how much you are truly needed. Meeting people who need your help is a strong incentive.

7. Boost your self-esteem Helping others makes you feel good about yourself, because you're doing something for someone that they couldn't do for themselves.

Research has shown that the good feelings you experience when helping others may be just as important to your health as exercise and a healthy diet. But it's the smile from a child or thankful person that shows you're really making a difference in someone's life. And that's the greatest feeling in the world!


