



Point in Time Survey Summary

On January 25, 2017 Sutter Yuba Homeless Consortium conducted a Point In Time Count in order to obtain accurate information about the homeless in Yuba and Sutter Counties and in the cities of Marysville and Yuba City. This snapshot count which is not all inclusive had 760 individuals participating in the survey. This survey was completed by those who are unsheltered, living on the streets or in vehicles, as well as those staying in a shelter. Not included were people temporarily staying with friends or family members.

Of the 760 individuals interviewed 52 percent were adults between the ages of 25 and 54; 23 percent were under the age of 18, 20 percent were seniors age 55 and up; and 5 percent were young adults ages 18 to 24. The gender of the 760 individuals was almost equally divided with 365 males and 350 females reported; three trans-gender were reported; and 42 did not respond. Other demographics reported by those interviewed: 45 were veterans, five were unaccompanied youth, 90 were victims of domestic violence, three were persons with HIV/AIDs, 88 declared chronic substance abuse, 77 are severely mentally ill, and 118 declared other disabling condition(s). There were 88 families and 500 individuals for a total of 588 households.

CSBG RECIPIENTS

As part of the grant process the State requires that recipients of CSBG funding document or demonstrate partnerships across community for specifically identified purposes and that the partnerships include other anti-poverty organizations. Not every partnership needs to be a formal, fully documented relationship, however it does need to be documented. LETTERS OF INQUIRY

Some foundations require that you send a letter of inquiry prior to completing a full application. Generally, this letter is printed on your letterhead and is usually no more than two to three pages in length.
